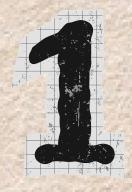

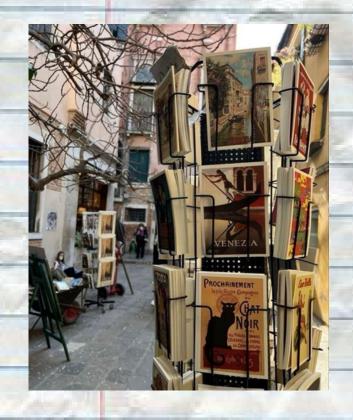
## The Journey Begins

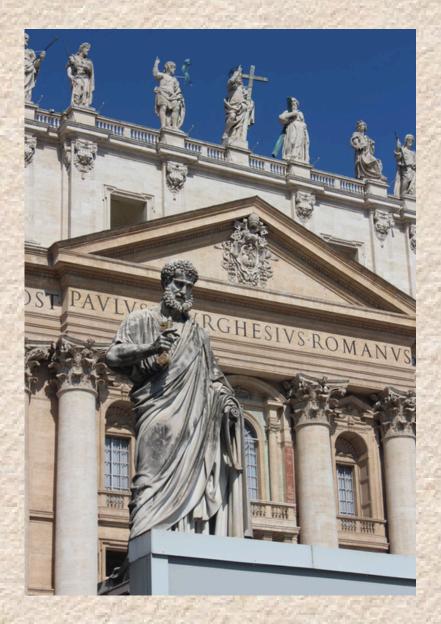


# Our Pilgrimage to the Basilicas

We returned home enriched with new understanding, unforgettable memories, and a deeper appreciation for our shared spiritual journey.

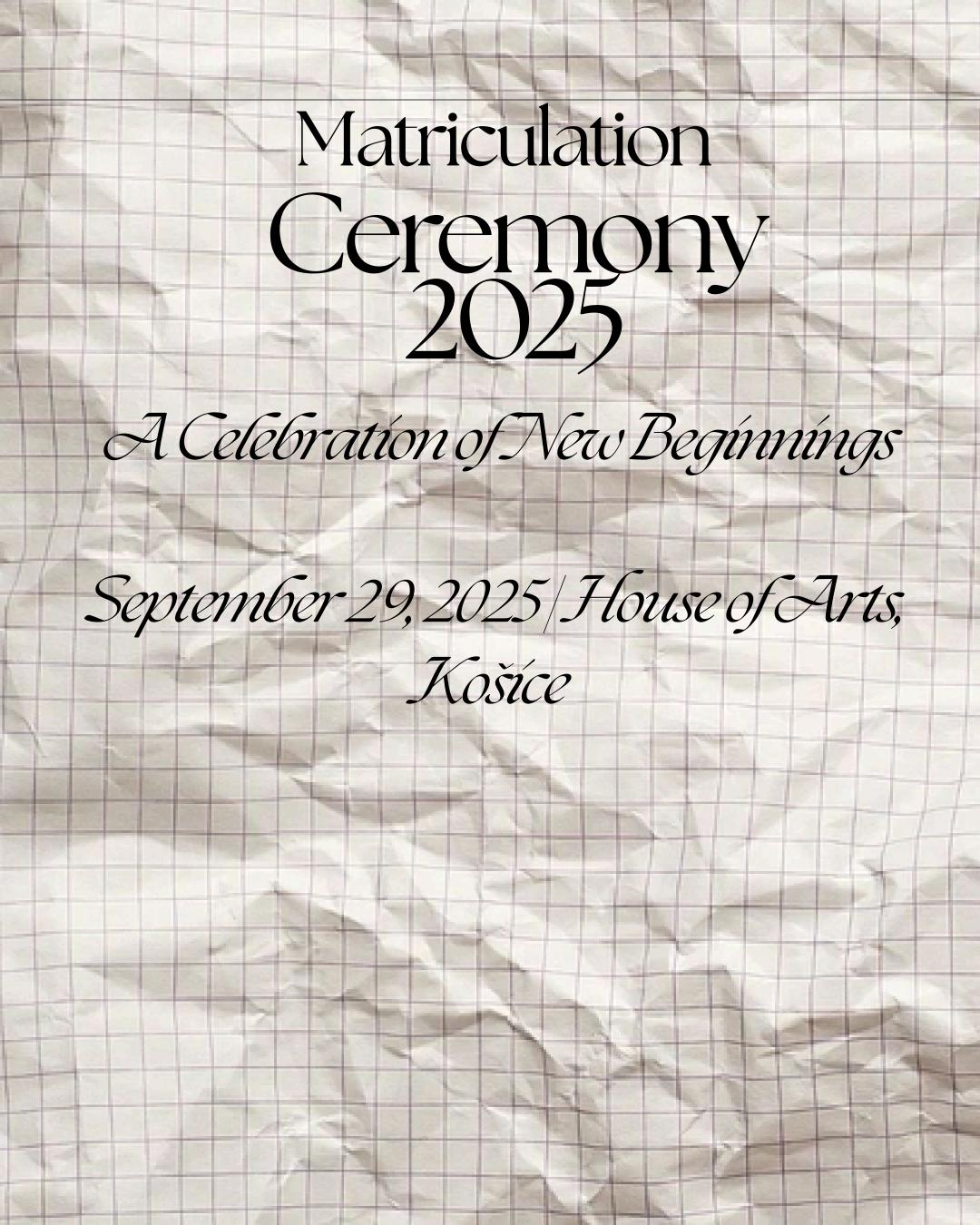
Traveling to Rome was not only about seeing beautiful places—it was about feeling connected to something greater.

On September 29, 2025, our first-year students officially joined our school community during the Matriculation Ceremony held at the House of Arts in Košice.

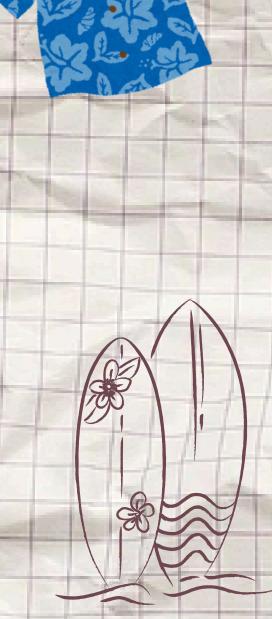


## Hawaiian Vibes

In the 2025/2026 school year, our school is completing its Erasmus+ project focused on mental health, well-being, and modern education.

Our goal was to create a school where everyone feels accepted, respected, and where mental balance is an essential part of learning.





To mark World Mental Health Day (October 10, 2025), we organized Mental Health Week filled with lessons, workshops, and creative activities about self-awareness, stress management, and mindfulness.

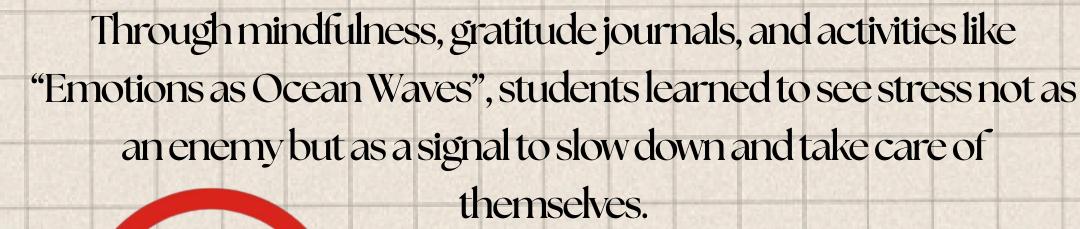
Each day had a special theme – Gratitude Day, Day of Silence, Day of Joy, and Day of Mutual Support.

We discovered that effective learning begins with inner balance.

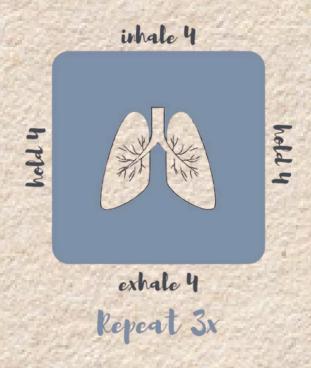
That's why we introduced well-being sessions – safe spaces to talk about emotions, stress, and coping strategies.



# Breathing, Movement, and Calm

During our "Stress Management" sessions, students practiced simple techniques that quickly became favourites:

Box Breathing (4-4-4-4) – for calm and focus.





Progressive Muscle Relaxation – to release tension, especially before exams.



Movement Breaks – short stretches to refresh mind and body.

These small rituals became student-initiated habits and showed how well-being can grow naturally in daily school life.

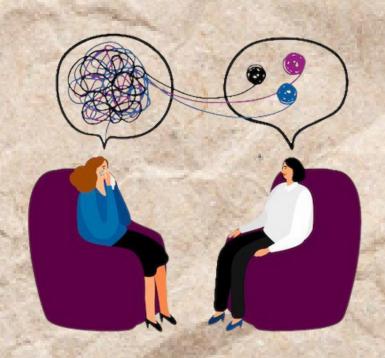


## Teachers as Mental Health
